Education and Training

This is a ST1 appointment in Orthodontics. This is a three year post. The post has been allocated a National Training Number.

The post is approved by the Regional Postgraduate Dental Dean in London, Kent, Surrey and Sussex for the training of Specialty Trainees in preparation for the Fellowship in Orthodontics.

Successful completion of the three years of the training programme will culminate in a recommendation by the Regional Postgraduate Dean to the GDC that the trainee is eligible for the award of a Certificate of Completion of Specialty Training.

Throughout the programme the post will provide formal and informal training opportunities with access to educational programmes both within the region and nationally. Training is structured according to the SAC approved clinical guidelines for specialty training in Orthodontics and accepted by the General Dental Council.

The trainee will be expected to develop an educational programme in conjunction with their Educational Supervisor. This will include the need for workplace based assessments throughout the programme. Educational progress will be reviewed annually (minimum) through the Annual Review of Competency Progression (ARCP) process.

Duties and Responsibilities of Postholder

The appointed candidate will be expected to:

- 1. Active involvement in new patient clinics for the advice, diagnosis and treatment planning of patients referred into the departments.
- 2. Treat a wide range of malocclusions, including Multidisciplinary cases (Orthognathic/minor oral surgery/ Restorative and Paediatric Dentistry)
- 3. Attend and participate in the running of MDT clinics
- 4. Active involvement and attendance at tutorials, lectures, journal clubs and organised teaching.
- 5. Undertake an active role in research within the department.



Main Training Site:

Barts Health NHS Trust

The Royal London is a leading, internationally renowned teaching hospital based in east London offering a full range of local and specialist services, which includes one of the largest children's hospitals in the UK with one of London's busiest paediatric Accident and Emergency departments. Home to London's air ambulance, The Royal London is also one of the capital's leading trauma and emergency care centres and hyper-acute stroke centres. The Royal London provides district general hospital services for the City and Tower Hamlets and specialist tertiary care services for patients from across London and elsewhere. It is also the base for the HEMS helicopter ambulance service, operating out of a specially built roof area. There are 675 beds, 110 wards and 26 operating theatres at The Royal London Hospital. The new building opened in February 2012 and is the largest stand-alone acute hospital building in Europe.

The Department of Orthodontics

The Department is grouped with the Department of Paediatric Dentistry with clinical facilities on the 1st Floor of the 'new' state of the art Dental Hospital opened in April 2014. The Orthodontic Department provides specialist training for an annual intake of 5-6 Postgraduate Students/Specialist Registrars on a 3 years training programme. The Department there- fore has 15-17 Postgraduate Students in Orthodontics. The clinics are equipped with up-to- date clinical facilities and are fully computerised arranged as a modern polyclinic. A dedicated room has been allocated for trainees with desk space and computers that can be used for digitisation or radiographs and tracing of radiographs. There is also a laser

scanning room that is part of the Oral Biometrics laboratory and clinical scientist support.

Second Training Site:

Northwick Park Hospital

Northwick Park Hospital is part of the London North West University Healthcare NHS Trust, which is one of the largest integrated care trusts in the country, bringing together hospital and community services across Brent, Ealing and Harrow. The trust employs over 8000 people and serve a population size of 850,000

The orthodontic department is located in the out-patient area of Northwick Park Hospital. There is a dedicated orthodontic clinic consisting of 5 surgeries, arranged in an open plan format, with consultant supervision on each clinical session. Digital radiographs are taken by radiographers and are available to view through PACs in each surgery. Digital photography is facilitated by a departmental Canon DSLR. All surgeries and offices have access to Dolphin imaging for cephalometic analysis and orthognathic surgical planning. Treatment modalities offered include fixed appliances, straight wire appliances, passive ligating appliance (Damon), and temporary anchorage devices.

The orthodontic and maxillofacial laboratory is located in the adjacent Maxillofacial Surgery unit and offers a full range of customized appliances. There are 2 Orthodontic and 1 Maxillofacial technicians. Regular multidisciplinary clinics are held within the department, with 4 orthognathic clinics a month, as well as monthly hypodontia clinic.
